The Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry (ODAFF) has compiled the attached report summarizing the Oklahoma poultry waste movement (state-wide), with more specific break-downs of poultry waste information from the Illinois River Watershed and the Eucha-Spavinaw Watershed.

The Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act (Title 2 § 10-19-1) and Rules (35:17-5) along with the Oklahoma Poultry Waste Applicators Certification Act (Title 2 § 10-9-16) and Rules (35:17-7) require the submittal to ODAFF of the following: 1) Oklahoma poultry waste applicator annual application reports by September 1 annually (for poultry waste applied in Oklahoma) and 2) Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding Operation records of poultry waste sold or given away. The enclosed information represents fiscal year 2016 (July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016) with the exception being the Eucha-Spavinaw Watershed section. This information is based on calendar year 2016, as the Federal Court Case Settlement requires applicators and poultry feeding operation annual reports represent a calendar year worth of records and the records are submitted to the ODAFF Eucha-Spavinaw Team by the end of each year. As a result of Oklahoma HB 2208, the litter applicator reporting date was changed from December 31 - as has been noted on previous reports - to September 1 annually. This is the first report noting this date change.

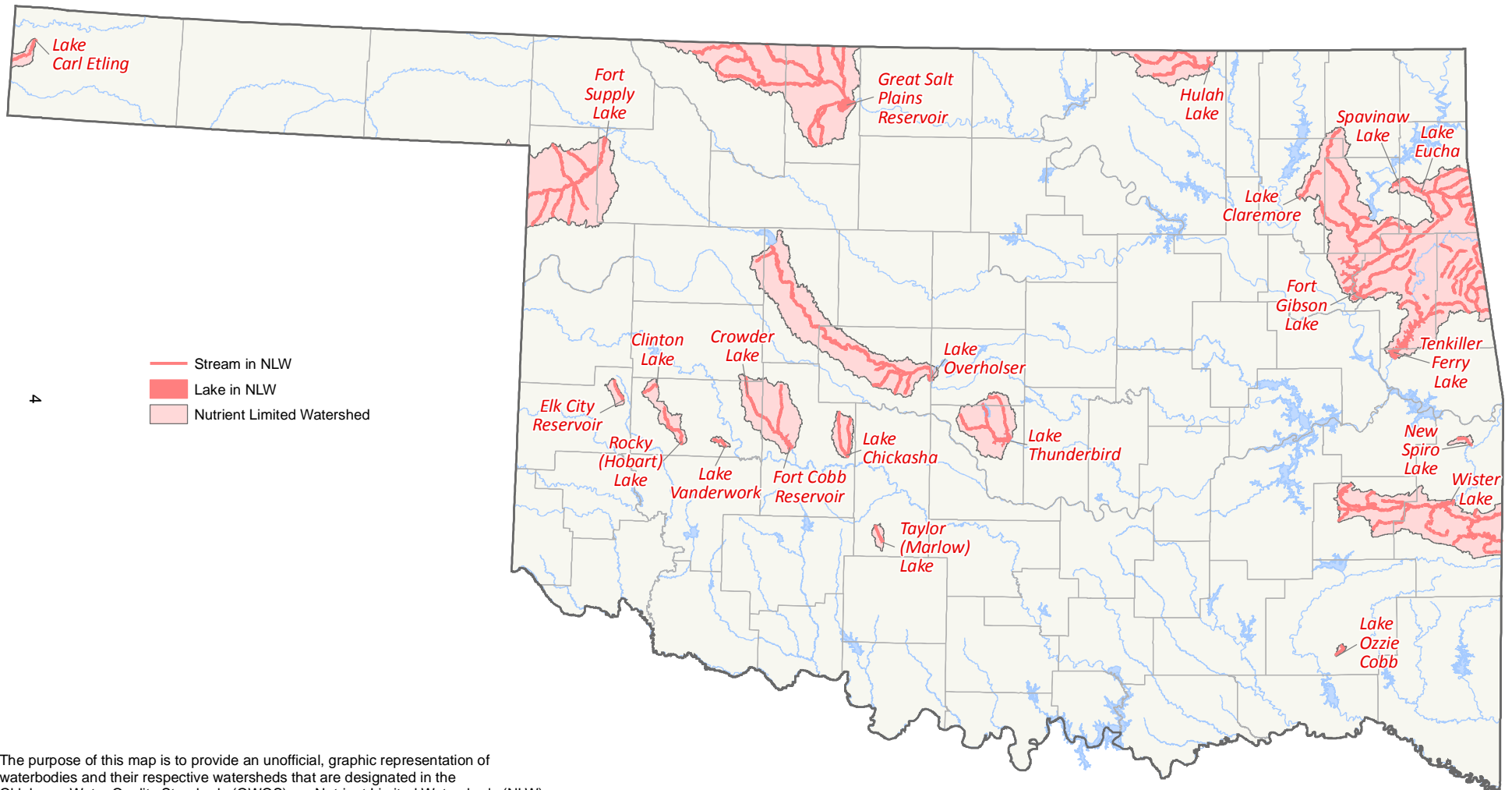
